Tony Beer Smith highlighted the changes proposed to our current Club Constitution. The resolution proposed is to be voted on tonight.

Resolution:

"that as this is an addition to or amendment of The Corvette Club of South Australia Incorporated Constitution: Final Draft, Effective 11th November 2020, Clause 12 Amendment of the Rules", be enacted at this meeting.

12. Amendment of the Rules

The Constitution may be added and repealed or amended at any Annual General Meeting at which notice of such intention had been given to Members at least fourteen (14) days before the meeting. A resolution from such a purpose shall require a Quorum (Twenty Five (25) per cent plus 1) Members voting thereon." (A vote of 50%+1, of Members present with full voting rights, shall pass, or reject such a resolution.)

That the members herein present at this meeting, being a Quorum, (as defined by The Corvette Club of South Australia Incorporated Constitution: Final Draft, Effective 11th November 2020, Clause **5.** <u>Voting</u>, g) A quorum shall be defined as Twenty Five (25) per cent of current Full Members present at the meeting, shall be accepted as a vote to <u>AMEND</u> the Constitution, to the **revised version dated the 15 February**, **2023** where a quorum will be ten (10) per cent of current Full Members present at the meeting.

and further,

That, all references in the Constitution be aligned with terminology used by The Department of Infrastructure and Transport (DIT) from 'Club Registration' to Conditional Registration for consistency, which includes the 'Club Registrar' to Conditional Registrar, 'Club Inspector/s' to Conditional Officer/s. Tom Stanef expressed that he felt 10% was too low. Neil Bailey also expressed the same view.

Rob McConnell advised Tom Stanef that as per email communications, any concerns about the proposed Constitution changes needed to be brought up with the Committee Member nominated on the email before COB 14/2/23, so they could be addressed prior to the AGM and any further amendments emailed to members.

Tony BeerSmith explained that it had been confirmed by Consumer of Business Affairs that our quorum can be any % that we have endorsed in our Constitution.

Tony BeerSmith & Rob McConnell explained that if there was a vote on a Special Resolution: The definition in Section 3 of the Act, Special Resolution of an incorporated association means:

- i) Where the Rules of the Association provide for the membership of the Association—a resolution passed at a duly convened meeting of the members of the Association if:
- ii) At least Twenty-One (21) days written notice specifying the intention to propose the resolution as a special resolution has been given to all members of the Association; and
- iii) It is passed at a meeting referred to in this paragraph by a majority of not less than Twenty Five (25) percent of financial members with voting rights at that meeting.

Proxy votes were also asked about. Rob McConnell explained that the Committee has decided not to include proxy voting at this stage.

Members were advised that only one member had responded by the closing date and that the changes they suggested had been incorporated, where a revised Constitution had been emailed to members 14 days prior to the AGM.

The 2 items above were passed by a majority of members.

(On behalf of all the members) The Chairperson thanked those on the committee over the last year and the effort they put in. He also thanked Jemma Kitto for stepping into the Treasurer Role last AGM.

He declared all positions vacant and asked if there were any further nominations to be received before he announced those received so far.

Rob McConnell advised voting was required for following 3 positions. Each position had 2 Nominees

Vice President – Catherine Neagle & Gunther Katzorke

Treasurer - Jemma Kitto & Peter Mourdoukoutas

Membership Officer – Gary McPhee & Larry Stanojevic

Thanks to all who came to make it a great night.






