Presidents Report: by Sean



Sean's President report.

Well, it's the middle of winter already. Things have slowed down a bit but there are still activities to be had. On July 7 we had the run to Gladstone organised by Debbie and Graham. The weather wasn't the best, but it is the middle of winter. We had lunch at the Booyoolee Brewery, try saying that after a few drinks! A good time had by the crew that went, thanks to Deb and Graham for organising the run.

Serge organised the Bocce challenge on July 20. Another successful outing doing something non car related. The mid year dinner at the Windsor Hotel on 26/7, organised by Maelyn will have been done by the time you read this.

Some people may have also noticed that the new Ultra High Performance Vehicle licence is now a thing in S.A. You will need this licence class if your vehicle is 276 kilowatts or more per tonne. So, what is that in English? If your car has 370 hp per 1000 kilograms, so what is that in simple English? Most Corvettes weigh around 1500 kg, some a bit less, some a bit more. A C4/C5/C6 is 1400 to 1500 kg, a C3 at least 1600 kg. Our C7 Z06 is just under 1600 kg (extra weight due to the supercharged engine). So, if my maths is correct (and I'm sure that I will be told if it isn't) that equals 555 hp per 1500 kg. The C6 Z06 is 505 hp and the C7 Z06 is 650 hp.

The bottom line is unless you have a C7 Z06 or C8 Z06 you won't need to get the licence upgrade. If you do, there is online training to complete on the government website. Sean.

HEADS UP – CLUB TALK ETIQUETTE FOR CLUB MEMBERS ATTENDING EVENTS

DINNERS

We would like to highlight some housekeeping rules for club members conduct when booking and attending events.

Please have consideration of the vendors and organisers of club events.

If you have booked a place at a seated event and are no longer able to attend, please ensure that you inform the organiser with reasonable notice or by due date allowing other members to attend.

Do not attend an event expecting a place if you have not made a prior booking.

We must respect the vendors capacity to hold the numbers allocated as this impacts their level of seating availability and staffing for meals and serving.

Not providing notice that you can't attend, could become a cost to the club if we have prepaid deposits for attendees.

<u>RUNS</u>

When attending a club run that has two (or more) meeting points (eg. a North and South meeting point), the organiser may designate a mid point rendezvous location. It is important to adhere to that location and timing for the following reasons.

This ensures we all arrive at the final destination as a group at the same time without creating disorganisation / misunderstandings.

If there are incidents along the way, club members will be aware to provide support to those affected.

No changes to be made to the route of the event unless approved by organiser of the event.

It is our intention to create an ethos that demonstrates professionalism and unity which in turn gives us credibility in the public arena.

Chuck Jordan's 1967 Corvette Batmobile

Randy Leffingwell's outstanding book – Corvette Sixty Years – offers this rare photo of a 1967 427 "Corvette Batmobile" that apparently was the result of a request from officials with the 1960s TV show, Batman.

"I've met Chuck Jordan several times over my career writing Corvette histories. This photo seems so implausible: dapper, disciplined Chuck sitting on a cartoon. Series creator Bob Kane and executive producer William Dozier asked GM Design's help in creating a suitable escape car for their lead character, Batman. The TV show ran from 1966 through 1968 and starred Adam West."

That's what Leffingwell writes in his book of this photo, which makes one wonder how seriously GM took the request of the series executives.

While a C2 Corvette is one of the most beautiful cars ever made, the 1967 Batmobile is hopefully a tongue-firmly-planted-incheek idea of what Chevy thought the Batmobile should look like – completely with stick-on Batman logos on the front end and headlights and huge rear spoiler.

For those who have been critical of the C7's new rear treatment, they should take a good look at this 1960s creation! Obviously, most folks will be glad that the TV show stuck with George Barris' excellent Batmobile which recently sold at Barrett -Jackson for \$4.2 million!

At least we can rest easy knowing that this Corvette Batmobile was easily able to be converted back to a normal – and beautiful – C2 Corvette!


