

Constitution Vote: - Life Membership

Last Current Constitution Membership Clause - NO CHANGE

Insert: 3.3.6 Life Membership.

Sean read out the new section for Life Membership and asked for any feedback.

Ruth van Doorn advised she is against life membership but if there is to be one, a nominal fee should apply.

Rob advised that with this new section, it was to recognise members that have been involved in the club and have made an effort to support and run the club.

It was pointed out that this amendment has been out to the members for at least 6 months, asking for thoughts or views...

A Member is unable to become a life member unless they have served on the committee for a minimum of 5 years.

This is then acknowledging people that have contributed their time and potentially financially to the club.

John Sturm – asked if Dave Nitschke would become a life member? He was involved in the club and was the President for many years. As the Constitution

amendment was not passed before Dave passed away, he would not be eligible for Life Membership.

Laurie Witts – Advised Dave Nitschke initially started Corvettes at the Port and then CRTB. What about naming the event after him?

Larry Stanojevic asked why there has to be committee duty? It was pointed out again that this is for people that have Served on the committee as acknowledgement of their time and effort.

If voted in, Constitution can be amended at a later date with the committee reviewing every 3 years.

However there is a fee involved each time to amend the Constitution.

John Randell – Advised the Constitution can be changed at an AGM and also at a Special Meeting. Doesn't have to be at the AGM.

Life members will be acknowledged at the next AGM, March 2021.

Constitution Vote:

The Chairperson then asked the members to go to a vote.

If you vote Yes – accepting the rules that the insert states that you are only eligible for Life Membership if you have served on the committee.

No – don't agree with Life Membership at all.


