


<mark>Birdw</mark>ood Mill Club D<mark>isplay</mark>

Any who John proposed the idea, advertised it and put a fair deal of effort into organising something special. A couple of exploratory trips were made to see what other clubs had done

and the space available. Sunday the 18th of June saw the commencement of our clubs display which will run through until the 16th of September. The current vehicles which will eventually include Mick Turner's C6 ZO-6, will remain in place until Saturday the 29th July when another four vehicles will be installed but the static display remain the same.


On arriving at the Museum, after a slow drive down the freshly graded road (grader missed all

the holes), we were met by Chris Soar, the person who set up & owns the Museum.



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Club Registration—New Rules



To all members of the Corvette Club of SA this is to advise you that with effect 30th June, 2017, the historic registration as we know it will cease to exist and with effect the 1st July, 2017 will be known as 'Club Registration'.

The following is required to obtain Club registration:

- 1. The owner of the vehicle being put forward for Club registration must:
- Be a financial member of the Corvette Club of SA; and b. Own a Corvette.
- p.2. Photos of the vehicle being put forward for Club registration will be required for

documentation purposes held by the Club and include the following:

- a. Engine bay.
- b. Interior.
- c. Left-hand side of vehicle.
- d. Right-hand side of vehicle.

- e. Front view of vehicle.
- f. Rear view of vehicle.

These photos have to be date-stamped to be acceptable.

- 3. Vehicle being proposed for Club registration must be:
- a. Legally registered in SA or,
- b. Have the ability to be legally registered in SA.
- 4. Final decision on acceptability of the vehicle being put forward for Club registration will rest with the Club Registrar, currently Mark Dixon.

It is recommended that any owner wishing to put forward a vehicle for Club registration should visit the SA Government web site as follows prior to approaching the Club so that they have an in depth understanding of the requirements and the policy content. Department of Planning, Transport and Infrastructure

<u>Changes to the Conditional Registration Scheme for Historic, Left Hand Drive and Street</u> <u>Rod Vehicles.</u>

· Now known as Club Registration – a 90 day conditional registration scheme for Historic, Left Hand

Drive and Street Rod Vehicles.

- · Vehicles will no longer need to be inspected by clubs prior to approval (MR334) being granted, although individual clubs are free to impose their own inspection requirements.
- · Vehicles not previously registered in SA (or previously SA registered vehicles not able to be located on historical records) may still need a departmental identity inspection prior to registration.
- · Year of eligibility will be a rolling 30 year from 1 January of each year. For example, all vehicles built in 1987 will be eligible from 1 July 2017 when the changes take effect. Vehicles built in 1988 will become eligible on 1 January 2018.
- The year of eligibility will be calculated from the date of manufacture, not compliance. In instances where a year may be recorded incorrectly on the registration and licensing database, owners can have the vehicle's identification plate sighted at Service SA and have the year corrected. Where the vehicle is unregistered it will still need to be presented for a sighting of the identification plate by either Service SA or inspectors at Regency park or Lonsdale inspection stations. An unregistered vehicle permit may be required.
- · Vehicles will be permitted to be modified and still be eligible to be registered on Club Registration. Modifications must be in line with the requirements in the Road Traffic (Miscellaneous) Regulations 2014 particularly Regulation 53. Otherwise an exemption must be obtained from Vehicle Standards prior to registration. For further information see this fact sheet or visit www.sa.gov.au. Clubs are not required to confirm if modifications meet with the regulations or if an exemption has been issued, this is the responsibility of the vehicle owner. This includes Street Rod vehicles.
- · Left hand drive (LHD) vehicles will be permitted to be modified and still be registered in SA. All LHD vehicles will still require a LHD exemption prior to registration, this document may need to include specific references to modifications if the vehicle is modified outside of the Road Traffic (Miscellaneous) Regulations 2014 particularly Regulation 53. These same rules apply to general registration and Club Registration.
- Left Hand Drives already issued an exemption certificate and planning to make modifications (minor or major) will need to contact Vehicle Standards on 1300 882 248 to discuss. They will need a new exemption issued in either instance. Vehicle Standards will commence a program of identifying exemptions issued and re-issuing with different wording permitting minor modifications but this will take some time. Owners can approach Vehicle Standards in the interim.
- · All authorised clubs will be permitted to approve any type of vehicle (Historic, LHD or Street Rod) for registration. This will be gazetted on the first Gazette notice after 1 July 2017 which will be 4 July 2017.
- · All club authorised people will shortly receive a new certificate of authorisation and accompanying letter clearly explaining the change to their authorisation.
- · New MR334 books will be available from 1 July 2017 with a revised declaration not including physical inspection of vehicles. These should be ordered in the normal fashion through clubs.
- · The old MR334 books can still be used after 1 July 2017. Although the declaration states the vehicle has been inspected this is no longer a requirement from 1 July 2017. DPTI would prefer old books are replaced within three months of 1 July 2017.
- DPTI is happy for logbooks to be issued at the same time as MR334 forms and suggests the person issuing the logbook on behalf of the club completes all vehicle identifiers provided on MR334.
- · Log books will still need to be replaced every three years. The log book will be redesigned in the coming months.
- · There is no longer a requirement to stamp registration papers. This applies to first registration and subsequent renewals.
- · A new Code of Practice will be published shortly (before 1 July 2017) and made available on www.sa.gov.au on the Historic, Left Hand Drive and Street Rod page

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




May 28th will have seen the running of the 101st Indianapolis 500 at the famous brickyard raceway. In 1978 the Corvette was given its debut as the pace car for the event, the silver and black beauty became an icon. This year the honour goes to a white 2018 Grand Sport gone are the flashy custom colours and stripes with the last few years seeing plain white vehicles with a minimum of graphics. The Grand Sport will be the fourteenth Vette to have the honour of leading the pack and the third in the C7 line up, 2013 saw the debut of the 2014 C7 Stingray in Laguna blue. Our next appearance was in 2015 with a white Z06 driven by Jeff Gordon of NASCAR fame at the wheel.

The 2018 model year car will come equipped with the Z07 package, which includes Michelin Pilot Super Sport Cup 2 performance tires,

Brembo carbon-ceramic brakes, and a more aggressive suspension calibration for improved handling an aggressive aero package. Powered by the LT1 6.2-liter V-8 producing 460 hp and 465 lb-ft of torque. The pace car version will use the optional eight-speed automatic transmission, magnetic ride control and an electronically controlled limited-slip differential. No wonder they keep asking us back as most of this is standard equipment on the Grand Sport model. No word has been given as to who the famous name will be at the wheel of the Vette at this time, as usual Chevrolet will produce a limited number of Pace Car replicas for sale to the public.
