PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Hi All



We are now at the halfway point and the days will now be getting longer and the summer cruising getting closer. Our club is entering a new phase in our history with a shift to new meeting premises at the Glenelg Baseball Club, fitting really both baseball and Corvettes are from the USA but nothing to do with Glenelg – until now – not quite true – Corvettes Rock the Bay. We may also be getting a few new members with the Government announcement that a rolling **25 years for conditional registration will now be eligible from 1st July 2022**, so that means if you have a car that was built in 1997 or before you are now eligible to put it on conditional registration providing you are a member of a club that is sanctioned by the Government to issue log books and complete the required paperwork, and our club is one of those. In these times of high fuel costs and everything else that you need to keep your car on the road it is a help that the registration is around \$210 for 3 years instead of \$800 for 1 year and you still get to drive it for 90 days per year, it also follows that if your car can only travel on the road for 90 days instead of the 365 days then your insurance premium should also drop because the chance of an accident is reduced. With all the country open it is pleasing that our club has trips away on every long weekend and also a Meet the Vics that is also fully booked out.



Next March we have the Nationals in Ballarat and this will be the first one since the Gold Coast in 2019 so there will be a lot of expectation for this one.

If you haven't been to a Nationals you should do at least one and this will be the closest one until we do ours in 2027, google Corvettes of Melbourne for all the information and the online entry form.

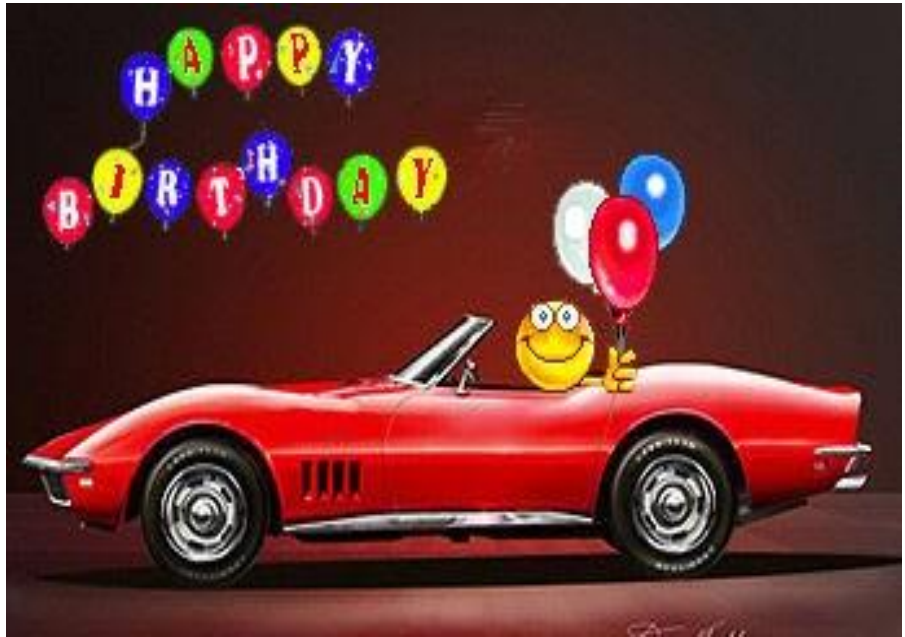

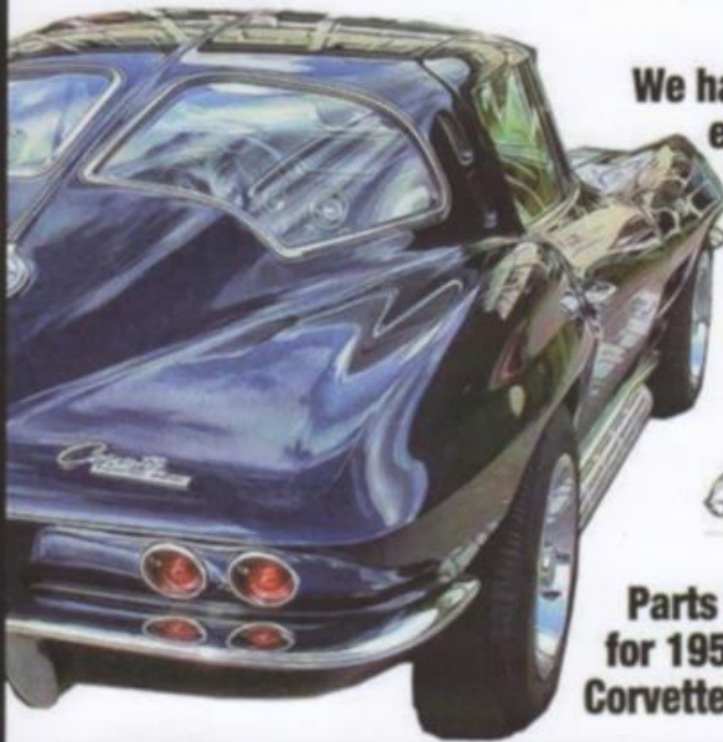
