While I think of it, has everyone looked at our website and in particular at the 800 photos of the convention, great job Pete.



RHD Corvette?

Right hand drive Corvette..........Cadillac dealers in Europe will distribute all models of the Corvette, including the almighty Z06. The same goes for the Camaro. It will be available in coupe or convertible in all trim levels. At the Geneva Auto Show earlier this month, Cadillac revealed their strategic plans for future growth in Europe stating that they are going to focus on brand positioning and improved customer service. Cadillac also wants to expand their model line up in Europe to match their offerings in the United States. This stands with Corvette's original announcement for the C7 that it would be produced in right hand drive within two years of release for the European market. What does this mean for us here in Oz.......I would speculate that if they are going to make these beauties in a right hook format that we will see them here. Ford have announced the release of the Mustang down under

and I would think that GM would not want it's biggest competitor to have this market all to it's own. Initial press releases from GM America stated we would see the Corvette here in a right hand drive format then there were retractions from GM Australia all of this during the period where they denied that Holden would cease production in Oz. So my opinion is that GM will be giving us a huge right hand drive present in 2016. Article by Neil Bailey

The nationals have come and gone very quickly, over two and a half years planning went into this event by a lot of people in this club. Somehow I managed to get my hands on a 2012 Z06 Commemorative Edition Corvette. I would like to thank Peter Altman for his generosity loaning me this vehicle and allowing us to display and drive it. This is one awesome beast. We are all use to people looking at our Vette's and giving us the thumbs up but this vehicle takes it to a whole new level, people point & stare, no one tries you on at the traffic lights, most are just in awe of this big black beast.

KB and I drove down to Reynella Mazda and picked her up on the Thursday before the nationals, I had



been told if you want her you need to come get her, no trailer required. We showed up and without any request for ID were given the keys to the 2012 Z06. Pulling out into traffic was intimidating simply because this thing is worth almost as much as my house. It didn't take long to get comfortable, in that you adjust the seat in about 7 directions. The clutch is a lot lighter than I had anticipated, I thought that my left leg was in for a work out on the drive home. For a supercar the clutch is very light with about the same pressure as my wife's Mazda RX-8. We picked the car up at about 2:30pm which meant that we had a reasonable traffic load on the way home. This is one mild mannered car in peak hour traffic she sat comfortably on or under the speed limit in fourth gear and wasn't a handful at any stage during the stop/starts. In fact I would say that it was a pleasure to drive in traffic, there were the usual Corvette problems in that the left wing mirror didn't afford you the proper view. It took me a while to get one of the features in the rear view mirror N—W—SW sorted, I initially mistook N for neutral then later realised it was a compass. Okay we finally hit the open roads Port River Expressway, Port Wakefield Road and then the Northern Expressway, she sits comfortably in 5th gear at the speed limit of 110 ticking over at about the 1200 rev mark. No matter which gear you are in acceleration isn't a problem she just responds to your right foot. After 2 hours in the car I am starting to feel reasonably comfortable, and for the first time punch the accelerator dropping back from 5th to 4th, your kicked back into the seat and quickly run through the speed limit and beyond. Peter Altman had this to say about the car "They are a very easy car to drive day to day, and that is a great feature. I have driven all sorts of Aston Martin, Ferrari and the like, and none are more docile and easy to drive around town as the Z06, and if you need power it is there in truck loads!"

Okay so what's so special about this car and why were we so keen to display it, as a Centennial she is only one of 250 cars produced in these specs and one of only 2 that made their way to our shores. As a Centennial Edition package she was made exclusively in Carbon Flash Metallic, with satin-black graphics and unique Centennial Satin Black wheels and red brake callipers. The wheels are constructed of lightweight cast-spun aluminium including a thin red outline around the perimeter. The wheels are specific to the following Corvette models, 18-inch/19-inch for Coupe, Convertible and Grand Sport; and 19-inch/20-inch for Z06 and ZR1. Magnetic Selective Ride Control is standard. The Centennial Edition also features special graphics that signify Chevrolet's racing history, the logo featuring an image of Louis Chevrolet on the B-pillars, wheel centre caps and the steering wheel. The seat headrests also carry an embossed centennial logo, the black leather interior is highlighted with red stitching on the dash and seats. The crossed flags badge contain a small adaptation, with "100" in place of the traditional fleur-de-lis symbol and are black instead of red. So the whole car is black except for some subtle touches of red and makes the car look super tough.

This Z06 has a 7.0 Litre LS7 aluminium V8 delivering 505 hp at 6300 rpm and 470 lb.-ft. of torque at 4800 rpm in standard form; the ZR1 models are powered by a 6.2 Litre LS9 with an output of 638 hp at 6500 rpm and 604 lb.- ft. of torque at 3800 rpm. Laurie was amazed with the brake rotors at 14" they were nearly as big as his 15" rims . This particular vehicle was mirror converted by Corvette Clinic in Melbourne and the job was outstanding, the stitching in the dash and doors lined up perfectly, the drivers and passengers seats had been swapped as they have different levels of functionality. The shifter had been moved across to the right of the console, the only thing that hadn't been swapped were the sun visors only noticeable in that the left hand one has the three pre-set buttons for the drivers seat. The tyres are Michelin street and strips that were fitted standard to this model and look just about bald! I really don't think they would be much use in the wet and thankfully I didn't get that experience. They retail out of the USA for about \$800(US) a piece, they were really grippy once you got some heat into them but were a bitch when cold and you had to be super careful not to light them up, once hot they attracted all sorts of debris and parking on a dirt verge is not recommended. The biggest point I took away from this vehicle apart from the power was the fact that you become one with the car it is a very easy drive even at speed and handles exceptionally well. You meld into the leather bucket seats and become very comfortable straight away, I never tired of the exhaust note with all four pipes wide open she has a great V8 rumble. I didn't bother trying out the selective ride suspension as I was pretty happy with the settings Peter had left on the car and it handled exceptionally well I never once felt that it was anywhere near her limits but I was super careful as it wasn't my car. Christeen even commented on the comforta-

ble ride and how you felt a part of the car (once she stopped screaming). Okay performance versus fuel economy, this thing is not thirsty at all for a 7 litre obviously if you drive it hard you pay for it, the thing ticks over quietly on the highway and gets on with it's job without fuss till you hit the loud pedal. Around town it barely raises it's voice and would be an easy economical daily drive. To put it into perspective it cost me around the same or less than it would have cost me to run my C4 5.7 over the weekend under the same conditions. From a standing start this thing easily pulls 90—100 km/h in first over 140 in second and 170 in third and stops very quickly without any fuss or discomfort. I have to apologise here to Peter for the Koala marks in his passengers seat!. I have driven some amazing cars over the years Brock Commodores, Subaru WRX STI's, Mitsubishi Evo's and various standard Vettes, this is without doubt the most comfortable and powerful vehicle I have had the pleasure of driving, simply put handing the keys back was not something I wanted to do!! SAFETY RECALL OF 2005-2007 C6 CORVETTES:

The following extract was sourced from: CorvetteOnline.com

"When the engine is warm, the underhood electrical centre housing could expand, causing the headlamp low-beam relay control circuit wire to bend slightly. After the wire is repeatedly bent, it can fracture and separate. When this occurs, the low-beam headlamps will not illuminate. As the housing cools and contracts, the low-beam headlamp function may return. This condition does not affect the high-beam headlamps, marker lamps, turn signals, daytime running lamps or fog lamps. Loss of low beam headlamps when they are required could reduce the driver's visibility, increasing the risk of a crash."

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
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
