

Custom & Classic Car Show

On Sunday the 7th August 2016, the Custom & Classic Car Show was held at Dueck GM on Marine, Vancouver BC. This show was collecting donations for the Canadian Special Olympic Team.

The show had about 180 cars attend ranging from a Model A Ford to C7 Corvettes, Hot rods to Rat rods.

Included in the show room was a 40th Anniversary Corvette that is a trailer queen with only 1000km on the clock. When it was received with 30km on the clock, it was fully disassembled and detailed. Now goes to shows to compete.

Feature Car: Freshly restored, matching numbers Black 1976 Corvette

An eye-catching car was Jim & Louisette Tennant's 1976 Corvette. Talking to the owners there is a bit of a story on how the car got to its first show. The car was originally sold in Dueck on Broadway,Vancouver in 1976. The original owner wanted a black on black car, but in 1976 the only option for a black interior was with the silver exterior finish. So the car was delivered in silver and immediately sent to the paint shop to go black.

Jim became the second owner of this car about 35 years ago and he used it as a daily runner back and forth from work. After about 5 years life got busy with mortgages, family and other commitments and the car was also in need of restoration. So the decision was made to park it up at his mother's garage until the time came to restore the car.

Sadly Jim's mother passed recently and in it came time to move the car out of the garage. There was no doubt in Jim and Lousiette's mind that this was the time to give the Vette a birthday and have a full restoration. The car was in good condition for the number of years it sat not running. The focus for Jim and Louisette was to keep the car as original as possible with no after-market mods, so every detail was accounted for in the restoration to ensure what was replaced was replaced like for like.

Both Jim and Louisette love driving this car. They have no intention of it sitting pretty in the garage. They like driving it and want to drive it.






