

The all new C7 Stingray is now in full production and they started shipping vehicles to dealers in the USA on 21st September the once hidden from view vehicle is now fully out in the public domain with the lucky first customers having taken delivery by the time you read this. "It's an amazing sight to see the transporters filled with Stingrays heading to customers in all corners of the country," said Dave Tatman, plant manager at Bowling Green. "The pride at Bowling Green is overwhelming and it shows in the tremendous quality and attention to detail going into each one of these new Corvettes." he said. The latest word out of the USA is that there is a 6 month waiting list for the all new Corvette.



Zr-1 news has the engine at left as definitely an LT1-style, Gen V Chevy small block, as evidenced by the injector cover shape and the fact that the throttle body is consistent with those used on the C7's LT1.

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

This is a marine grade solar panel which is semi flexible, it has an in built regulator.


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weather proof, its really slim & light weight, the brand is SolarLand Australia. It's a 10 w 19.0 volt unit weighing in at a whole 1.1 kg it

measures a huge 350 x 258 x 17 mm. The only modification I have had to make was the soldering of some jumper lead style clamps

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
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### A VF version of the Holden Monaro has gone "viral" after a secret design study was accidentally leaked via social media.



These images were meant to appear briefly on a big screen during the 35th anniversary celebrations of the Monaro Car Club SA and then to be never be seen again.

But the photos have since appeared in the mainstream media after they were posted on a Holden designer's Facebook page.

Holden fans calling for the revival of the home grown coupe almost eight years after the last Monaro rolled down the Holden production line at Elizabeth have been told it will only ever exist on computer screens.

These photos look like a real car because they were created using the same technology Holden uses to design production vehicles. These images of the modern Monaro were originally used in a Holden design training exercise.

Melbourne-based Holden designer David Kaylor blended existing "parts" from the new VF Commodore with the Coupe 60 concept car that was unveiled in 2008 to celebrate Holden's 60th anniversary.

Senior Holden designers Mike Simcoe and Peter Hughes who were instrumental in the 1998 Commodore Coupe concept car that led to the rebirth of the Monaro in 2001 were so impressed they took the images with them to surprise the SA Monaro Car Club at its anniversary bash in Camden Park.

The 104 guests at the gala event were briefly shown the images of the cyber Monaro and were told it's what the two-door coupe version of the VF Commodore could look like it is approved.

"We couldn't believe our eyes and of course we said Holden should build it," said Fiona Schulz, the president of the Monaro Car Club SA, who owns three Monaros with her husband Don.

"But they were very quick to point out it was never going to happen. It's a tragedy but General Motors says a new Monaro won't sell in big enough numbers."

Permission to post the images on Facebook was granted after the SA event, but Holden wasn't expecting them to attract such attention. "We don't want people to hold out for a car we're not going to build. We want them to buy a Commodore," said a Holden insider, who insisted the leak was not a publicity stunt.





The last Holden Monaro ever made was sold at auction six years ago for \$188,000 to raise money for charity.

But the last brand-new Monaro in dealer stock was sold only last year.

The burnt orange HSV GTO Coupe with just 15km on the clock was kept by Holden dealer Alan Mance as a collector's piece.

- 4 Vehicle Exemption Document for left hand drive vehicles, issued by DPTI
- 5 Statuary Declaration required every year at log book signing

Statuary declaration must declare vehicle eligibility to the scheme and detail any modifications that have been made since last inspection, if none made then the statuary declaration must declare that

### BOOKS WILL NOT BE SIGNED IF ALL DOCUMENTS ARE NOT PRODUCED

Books have to be signed before December 31st for vehicles to be legally driven on road, if your book isn't signed you are driving an unregistered vehicle.

Inspections and issue of new log books will be every 3 years

If your log book is not signed, notify club registrar with a reason why. Eg car off road for repairs

If your membership has not been renewed and the log book signed by the 31st of January DPTI will be notified and the Conditional Registration will be cancelled by the department.

It is a requirement under the new code that the club notifies the department as a condition of maintaining our recognition status for the purposes of the scheme


